Rules - All species will conform to all Uniform Junior Fair Rules found on pages 6-10 of this handbook. Please read these rules.

1. All goats must have a scrapies tattoo or tag number from the USDA.
2. Two (2) market goats may be registered, weighed and tagged on Thursday, April 30, 2010 at the Hog Barn at the fairgrounds between 6:30 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Animals will be tagged with OSDA tags by committee at weigh in. Lost tags must be reported to the Goat Committee within 3 days and arrangements made to have the animal retagged. Scrapies tags must be in place before weigh in. Only one (1) market goat may be exhibited and sold at the fair. Market goats must be born after December 1st of the previous year. Market Goats must weigh 50 lbs or more at the fair to compete for Grand and Reserve Champion. All exhibitors selling their market goat must be in the barn at 3:00 p.m. the day of the sale. The goats appearance and yours should be neat. The market goat sale is a partial-terminal sale.
3. Only one entry may be entered per person per class. Check the show list before the day of the show to make sure you are in the correct class.
4. No buck goats may be housed or shown at the fair.
5. *All goats must not have horns or scurs over 3/4 inch with the exception of Boer Show goats. Market goats must be dehorned.*
6. Straw is the only bedding to be used in the Goat Barn.
7. No rope type hay bags are to be used at the fair.
8. All 4-H Goat shows will follow the Open Class Goat shows on the perspective days. Each 4-H Goat show will begin with Showmanship. Showmanship classes show oldest to youngest by your 4-H age. Novice Showmanship Class is offered for first year or first time project youth between the ages of 9 – 12 years. Sign up for showmanship is in the goat barn on the office wall the morning of that days show. Showmanship is strongly recommended but not required. It is your responsibility to be in the show ring at the correct time for your class(es). The show will not be held for late arrivals, be ring side and be prepared.
9. Always attend and listen carefully at all clinics for possible changes in the rules or shows. There are several bulletin boards in the barn at the fair. CHECK THEM OFTEN. The committee will give you as much advanced notice as possible. It is YOUR responsibility to know what is going on with your project.

10. If there is a shortage of stall space the committee reserves the right to limit the number of goats each 4-Her may bring to the Fair. After your stall space is assigned to you by the committee you are encouraged to decorate it. Nothing may be in the aisle way. No thumb tacks are permitted. You must make sure that neither your goat or your neighbors goats can reach the decorations.
11. All 4-Hers must sign up for one (1) goat barn duty session.
12. Morning feedings, milking and pen cleaning must be done everyday by 11 am. Evening chores are to be done between 4 – 7 pm. If you can not be there to feed and clean, you must contact a committee member to make other arrangements. Have a committee member check your stalls in the mornings and mark you off. Failing to have your stalls checked daily and reporting for a barn duty will have your premium check withheld.
13. All 4-Hers are responsible for feeding and watering their own animals each day. Never feed or get into the pen of someone else's goats without their permission. Do no lead or carry your goat up the midway past the steer barn at any time. Do not block the aisle of the barn with chairs, goats or wheelbarrows after 11 am..
14. The committee provides shovels, pitchforks, rakes and wheelbarrows.
15. No children will be allowed to stay in the barn overnight without being accompanied by an adult.
16. On Sunday night, the exhibitor must clean the pen out between 7 pm – 10 pm. Do not put in new bedding. Pens must be checked by a committee member before the exhibitor is allowed to leave. No one may remove their projects before 8 pm on Sunday. If you are leaving a Market Goat, leave a thin layer of bedding and a small bowl for water we can throw away.
17. The base date for computing the age of animals is the fair show day.
18. Please remember we are only volunteers. We are doing everything we do so everyone has a great fair.
19. If an animal receives a vet release the committee must be notified and arrangements made to remove the animal immediately. Vet released animals are not to be shown. See Rule 30 in Uniform Rules.

Dairy Goats

- D1. Jr. kids born April 1 of current year until registration clinic
- D2. Int. kids born between March 1 - March 31
- D3. Sr. kids born between Jan. 1 - Feb. 28
- D4. Yearling dry doe born before Jan - 1 and under 2 years old
- D5. **Grand & Reserve Champion Jr. Dairy Goat** (1st & 2nd places in classes D1 – D4)
- D6. Does 1 year old and under 2 years old, in milk
- D7. Does 2 years old and under 3 years old, in milk
- D8. Does 3 years old and under 5 years
- D9. Does 5 years and older
- D10. **Grand & Reserve Champion Sr. Dairy Goat** (1st & 2nd places in classes D6 – D10)
- D11. Mother & Daughter, any age
- D12. Dairy Herd, 3 does any age, at least two in milk, owned by family
- D13. Dry Dairy Doe (any dry doe not eligible for other class)

Pygmy Goats

- P1. Does born May 1 of current year until registration clinic
- P2. Does born between Feb. 1 to April 30
- P3. Does born between Nov. 1—Jan 31
- P4. Does born between Aug. 1—Oct. 31
- P5. **Grand & Reserve Jr. Pygmy Doe**
(1st & 2nd places in classes P1 - P3)
- P6. Does 1 year and under 2 years old
- P7. Does 2 years old and under 4 years
- P8. Does 4 years old and older
- P9. **Grand & Reserve Champion Sr. Pygmy Doe**
(1st and 2nd places in classes P5 - P7)
- P10. Mother & Daughter, any age
- P11. Pygmy herd, 3 animals of any age, 1 doe must have freshened since the last year's fair, owned by family
- P12. Wethers born May 1 of current year until registration clinic
- P13. Wethers born between Feb. 1 and April 30
- P14. Wethers born between Nov. 1 and Jan. 31
- P15. Wethers born between Aug. 1 and Oct. 31
- P16. **Grand & Reserve Champion Jr. Pygmy Wether**
(1st & 2nd places for classes P11 - P13)
- P17. Wethers one year old and under 3 years old
- P18. Wethers 3 years old and older
- P19. **Grand & Reserve Champion Sr. Pygmy Wether**
(1st & 2nd places in classes P17- P18)



Boer and Market Goats

- B1. Junior Doe born April 1 of current year until registration clinic
- B2. Senior Doe born January 1 – March 31
- B3. Yearling Doe under 2 years
- B4. Mature Doe 2 years and under 3 years
- B5. Aged Doe 3 years and older
- B6. Grand and Reserve Champion Boer Goat** (1st and 2nd places in classes B1 – B5)
- B7. Mother and daughter, any age, any sire
- B8. Produce of dam, 2 does from the same dam
- B9 Get of Sire, 3 does from the same sire, at least 2 different does

Market Goats (There will be only one class if there are less than 12 entries in M1 & M2)

- M1. Light Weight
- M2. Heavy Weight
- M3. Grand & Reserve Champion Market Goats** (1st & 2nd places in class M1 & M2)
